| *For students applying for law courses, they must meet School of Law's minimum CGPA requirement 3.0; and minimum English requirement of TOEFL 100 (internet-based test) / IELTS 7. The TOEFL and IELTS scores should be valid for 3 years from the test date.   |
| Yes, but subject to approval of the home and host institutions.  Application for re-admission should be raised before 15 May for Semester A enrolment and 15 October for Semester B enrolment to allow enough time to process the application and apply for extension of visa.  |

|   | Students must purchase insurance for themselves before they come to Hong Kong. The insurance should include, but not limited to, medical and travel insurance that will cover the entire period of their study in Hong Kong. If they are unable to do so or wish to have additional insurance coverage, they may enrol in the insurance plan for non-local students.
